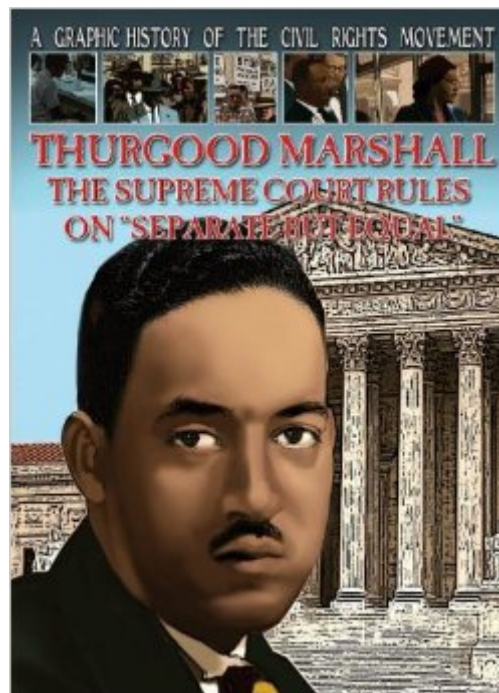


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Thurgood Marshall: The Supreme Court Rules On "Separate But Equal" (Graphic History Of The Civil Rights Movement)
